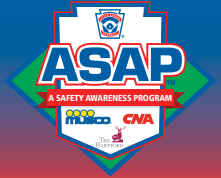

Honoring Safety Effort

What a Series! The leagues honored for maintaining the best safety programs across the country met in Williamsport, Pa., for some great games last month. A new ASAP Awards Breakfast honored the leagues with the best safety plans, as well as the District Administrators who are supporting the leagues' safety efforts.

The selection process was more difficult than ever, as over 3600 plans were received at Little League headquarters and reviewed for the awards. The eventual winner, Winslow Township, N.J., Little League, edged out competition with a combination of training initiatives, safety equipment improvements, facilities procedures and making the entire plan the effort of all participants, young and not so young.

This year's winner was a runner-up last year, and two regions' winners were from states which had never placed before: Indiana in the Central and Nevada taking the top spot in the West.

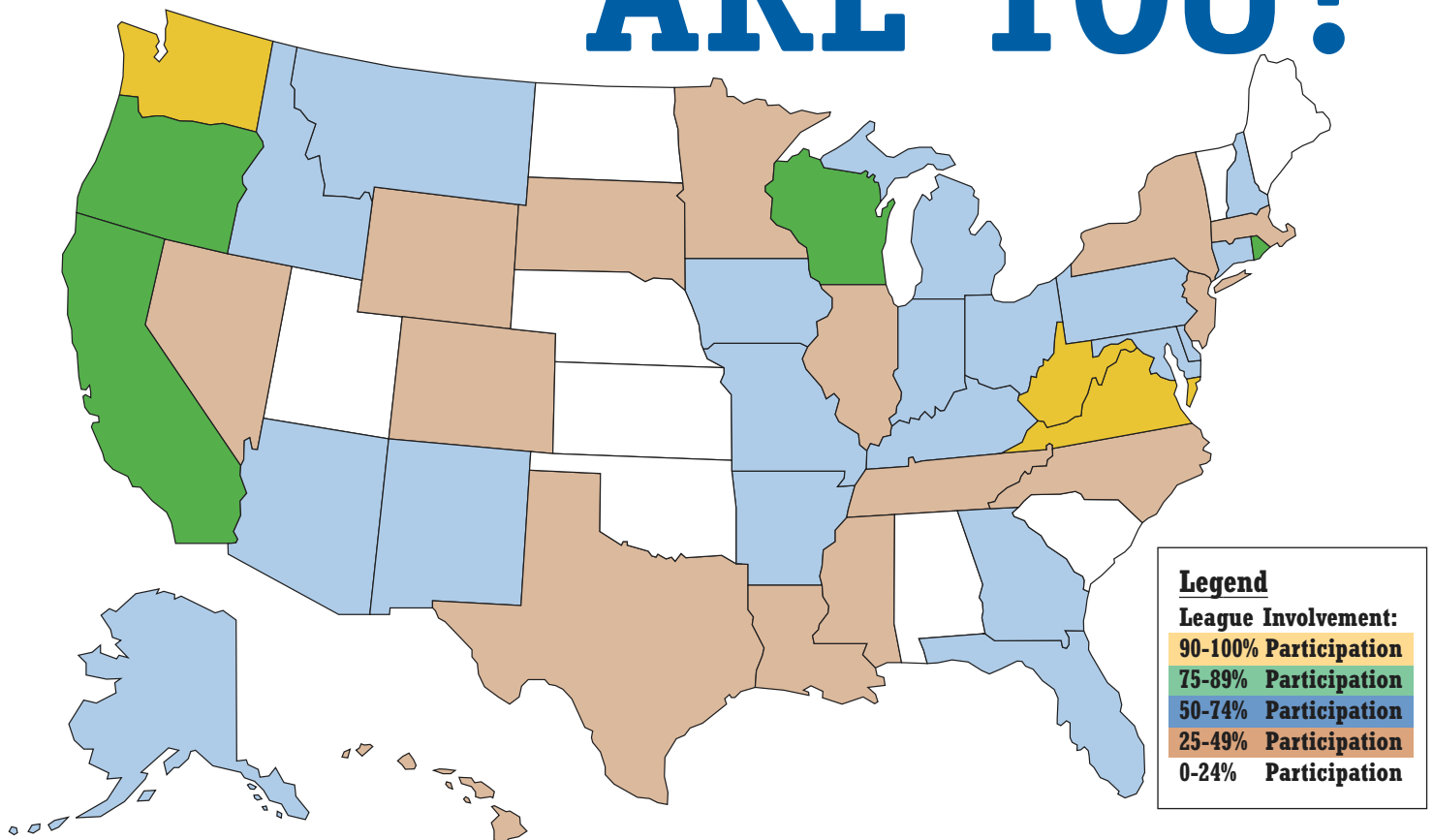

U.S. Reducing Injuries ARE YOU?



Leagues take up safety effort across the US; no state is at zero and most going up, up, up!

In 2004, Little League Baseball, Inc., jumped to well over half of all leagues operating a safety plan, improving the chances that the participants in those leagues won't be unnecessarily hurt.

That's all due to the efforts of safety-conscious people in every state, working to make their league better in ways that mostly show in what's NOT happening.

Of all districts in the U.S.:

- 30 percent are operating at 90-100 percent of their leagues with a qualified safety plan;

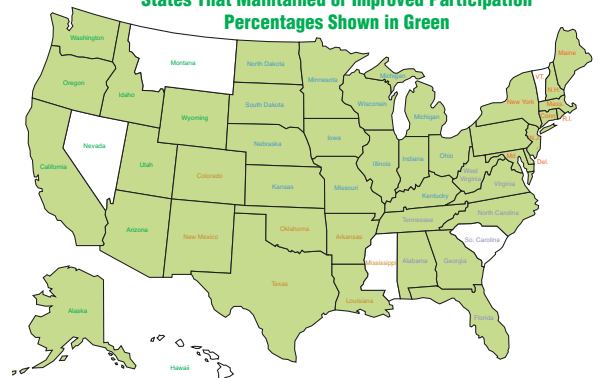
- 21 percent have earned the award for maintaining their district at the 90-100 percent participation level for two or more years;
- 14 percent have between 50-74 percent of all their leagues with a qualified safety plan, and;
- 8 percent are now with 75-89 percent of their leagues having active, qualified safety plans.

No state still at zero participation

What we have seen is that districts which are at 0% can stay there indefinitely, but once one or two leagues sees how much of a difference having a safety plan makes, other leagues in that district start to develop safety plans, too.

So it is especially good news to report all states are participating in increasing safety awareness, and as the graphics above show, most are maintaining or building on their participation.

States That Maintained or Improved Participation Percentages Shown in Green



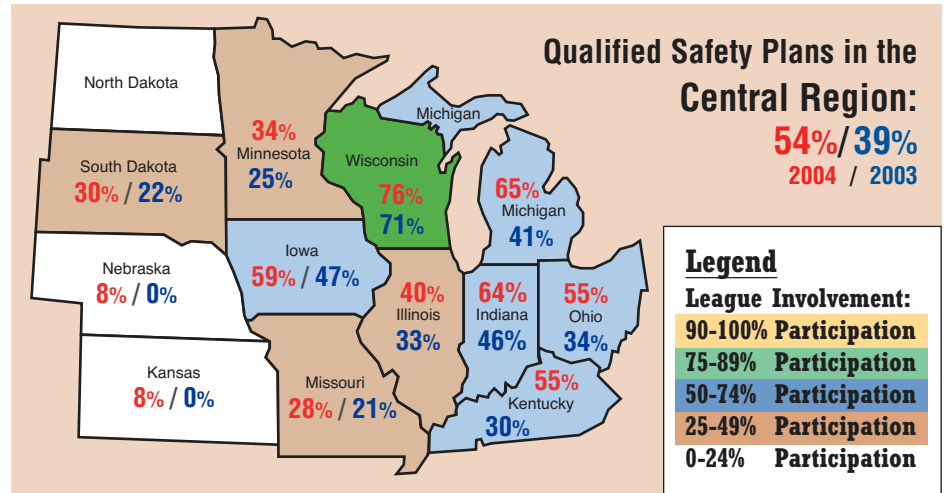

Central Makes Big Jump: 15%

In '04, U.S. ASAP participation grew to **58%** of leagues submitting safety plans. This meant 60% of all Little Leaguers played under a safety plan!

- Central Region 54 percent**
- Eastern Region 50 percent**
- Southern Region 65 percent**
- Western Region 76 percent**
- Southwestern Region 45 percent**

The total insurance credit claimed by all leagues by participating in ASAP in 2004 was over **\$480,000**.

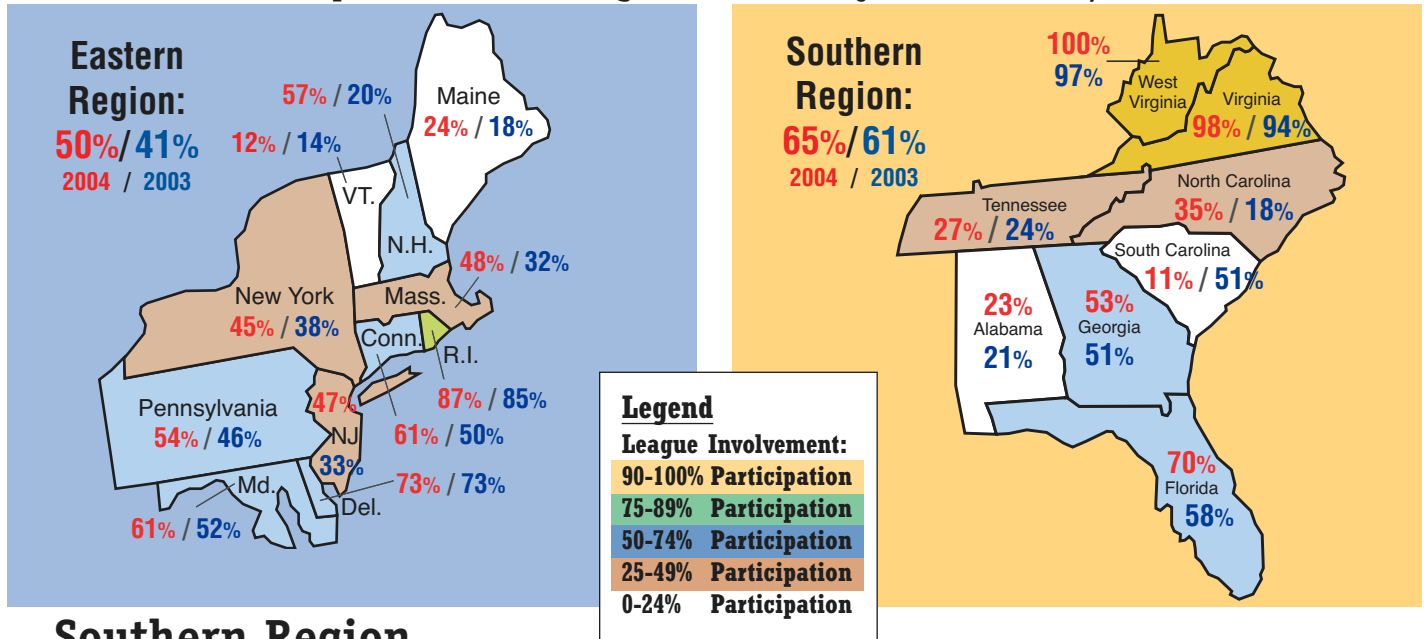

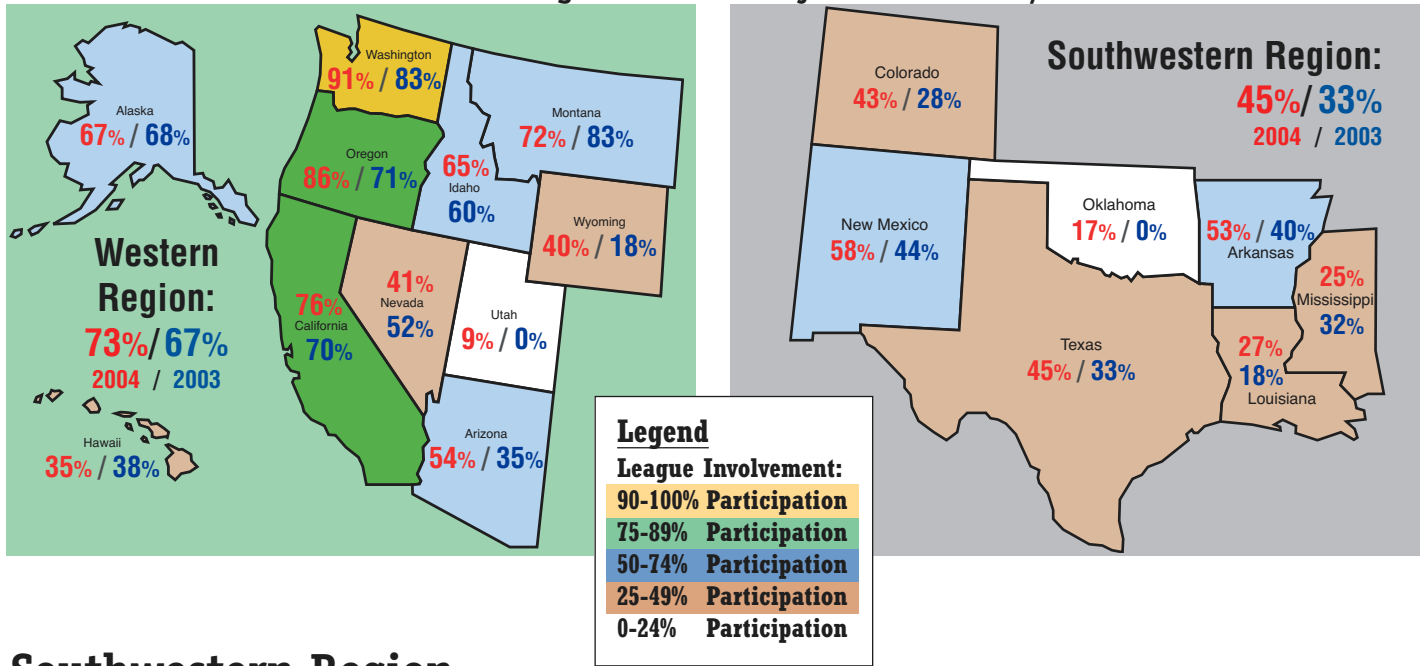
